## MAYOR & COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 10, 2020 6:30 P.M.

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Rockaway, in the County of Morris, New Jersey, was held in the Community Center, 21-25 Union Street, Rockaway, N.J. with Mayor Thomas Mulligan presiding. Mayor Mulligan called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Mulligan read the following statement: In accordance with Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, Public Laws, 1975, be advised that notice of this meeting was made by posting on the Bulletin Board, Town Hall, and sending to the officially designated newspapers, indicating that the meeting would take place as a telephonic meeting only at 6:30 p.m. on this date.

Borough Attorney Joseph J. Bell, Jr., Esq., was also present.

Everyone present participated in the salute to the flag.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

Mayor Mulligan read a letter from Wasko Construction. Requesting permission to sell Christmas trees at 100 Hibernia Avenue from November 26, 2020 through December 24, 2020.

On motion by Councilman Haynes, seconded by Councilman McDonald, and unanimously carried by voice vote to accept the correspondence, and approve the request of Wasko Construction.

#### COUNCIL/COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman McDonald - Personnel Committee

Councilman McDonald thanked the Department of Public Works for their assistance at Smith Field.

Councilman Hurley - Finance and License Committee

*Payment of Bills* - Upon motion by Councilman Hurley, seconded by Councilwoman Burnside, and carried unanimously upon voice vote, that the bills presented to the Borough of Rockaway for payment by the Borough, as evidenced by proper vouchers, be referred to the Committee or unit contracting for same, and, when endorsed by them and approved by appropriate action of Council, that they are to be paid.

Councilman Hurley thanked the CFO/Administrator for all of her hard work with Bond Counsel.

Councilman Hurley reported that the Historical Committee will be holding their annual yard sale on October 3, 2020.

Councilman Greuter - Public Safety Committee

Councilman Greuter reported that there were 10 arrests and 68 summonses issued in the month of August. The speed sign is currently on Crestwood Drive and, as requested at the last meeting, it will be placed on West Main Street next.

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Councilwoman Burnside - Fire Committee

Fire Department - Councilwoman Burnside reported that the Fire Department scheduled drills on September 9<sup>th</sup> and September 30<sup>th</sup>.

Library – Councilwoman Burnside reported that the library is working on a plan to reopen to the public.

Board of Health - Councilwoman Burnside reported that flu shots will be available to residents, by appointment only, on September 17<sup>th</sup> and October 8<sup>th</sup>.

Councilman Haynes - Public Utility and Works Committee

Councilman Haynes reported that the Department of Public Works will be submitting a new water allocation permit along with a new drought plan to the Department of Environmental Protection by end of month.

Personnel (matter involving employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of, promotion, or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that the matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting) Confidential Per Express Provision of Federal Law or State Statute Release of Information Would Impair Right to Receive Federal Funds Disclosure of Information Would Constitute Unwarranted Invasion of Individual Privacy PBA Collective Bargaining Agreement Negotiations Teamsters Collective Bargaining Agreement Negotiations Purchase, Lease, or Acquisition of Real Property with Public Funds, or Investment of Public Funds Tactics or Techniques to Protect Safety and Property of Public Deliberations May Result in Imposition of Specific Civil Penalty

- 3. The minutes of the discussion shall be made public as soon as the matters under discussion are no longer of a confidential or sensitive nature.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
